



**Adam R. Rose** is a philanthropist in the areas of public safety, jazz, and horticulture. He retired in 2020 from a 36-year career at the 90-year old Rose Associates as a real estate developer and manager specializing in large apartment buildings. Career highlights include the creation of the Madison Belvedere (404 units), Chelsea Landmark (407 units), The Helena (600 units), and the Metropolis (370 units) which are all in Manhattan. He ran Peter Cooper Village and Stuyvesant Town for a total of five years in two assignments, supervising all services for 25,000+ residents including holding the position of Commissioner of Public Safety. The PCVST property has an onsite 60-person uniformed peace officer department which makes arrests.

Adam has served on the board of numerous organizations including Jazz at Lincoln Center, The New York Botanical Garden, the New York Public Library, and Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden. He is currently a trustee of the New York City Police Foundation and the FDNY Foundation.

Together with his husband, Peter R. McQuillan (retired NYPD Sergeant), Adam has named numerous facilities including those at the New York Botanical Garden, the Westchester Land Trust, the Jacob Burns Film Center, the Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden, and the Katonah-Lewisboro School District.

Adam plays jazz piano and tennis but not at the same time. Former licenses from the State of New York include Real Estate Broker, EMT, and Armed Security Guard.

Adam's interest in law enforcement began with his service as an Auxiliary Trooper with the Connecticut State Police while he was obtaining his B.A. from Yale College. He continued with summer sworn positions with two departments in Massachusetts. As the primary security director at Rose Associates he also worked closely with the FBI, Secret Service, and NYPD.
