- Permission for reproduction is limited to the applicant and is non-transferable and may not be reused on another project, assigned, or sold without the permission of the Museum.
 Permission for reproduction is granted only for the express purpose described in this form.
- You shall have no right to recast, adapt or transform the material (except to the extent explicitly provided in the form) without express written permission of the Museum.
- Permission for use of its materials cannot be granted in perpetuity; use will be limited to a
 maximum term of 5 years. Any use after this initial term will require written permission
 from the Museum and may entail additional fees.
- Permission for use of the Museum's materials is only granted for one media format;
 adaptation or reuse of the material in a different media format requires written permission from the Museum and may entail additional fees.
